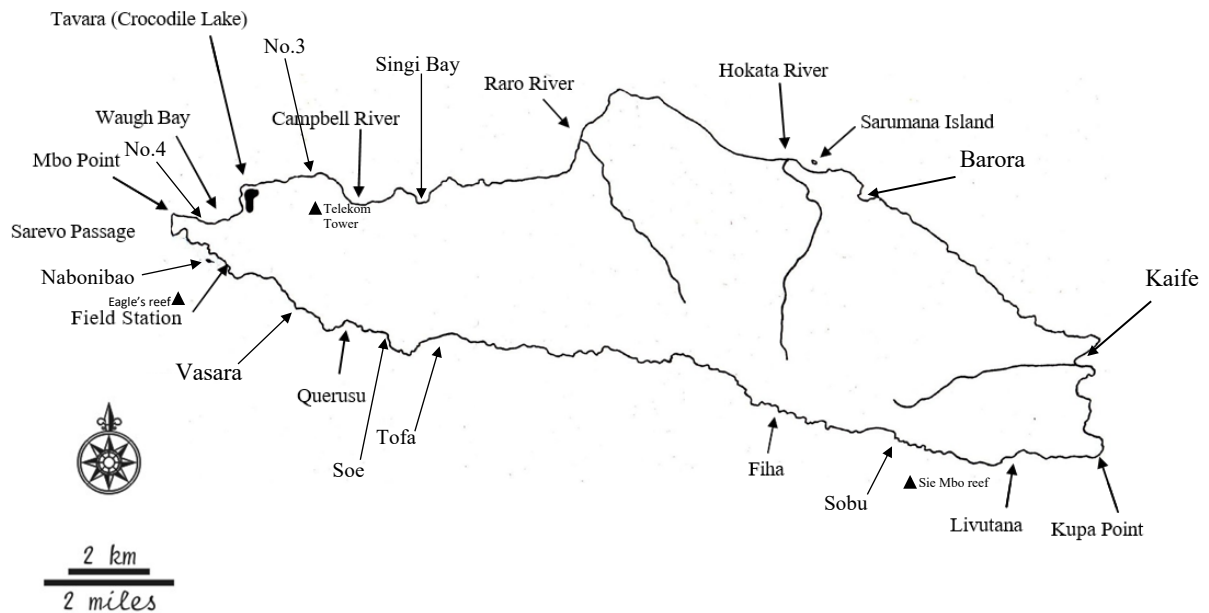


Tetepare Activities Price List (all activities include a guide)



Activity costs cover petrol use for the boat as petrol is very expensive in the Solomon Islands. Night activity costs are used to cover costs of torches and batteries.

Birdwatching - enjoy a walk into the lush forests of Tetepare Island to view the beautiful birds. There just might be a wonderful surprise in store for the keen birdwatcher. \$300 per person per full day. \$150 per person per half day. (you must bring your own birdwatching equipment)

Coconut Crab walk- a nocturnal walk around the field station to look for the largest land crab in the world. \$50 SBD per person, duration 1 hour.

Night walk- a night walk around the loop trail to search for bats, frogs, crabs, bioluminescence, fireflies and interesting creatures that come out at night. \$50 SBD per person, duration 1 hour.

Straggling fig and Useful plant walk - a walk that will take you to the towering fig trees and along the way you'll get to learn about the traditional uses of many plants.

Turtle Rodeo- accompany the rangers during their monitoring work capturing and tagging green and hawksbill turtles in the lagoon (on boat). \$450 SBD per boat, duration 1.5 hour

Dolphin Watching - let your guide know if you would like to see dolphins and if spotted from the eatery lookout you can hop in a boat and go out to meet them. \$250 SBD, duration 30mins.

Snorkelling on the MPA reef - Eagle's Reef - the best snorkelling on this reef is early in the morning or at dusk. Turtles, stingrays and beautifully coloured fish are all present at these times. The amazing bioluminescence are usually present as well. \$150SBD, duration - 1.5hr max.

Snorkelling on the MPA reef - Nabonibao reef - similar to Eagle's Reef boasts an impressive array of marine life. Best times are at dawn and dusk. \$150SBD, duration - 1.5hr max.

Snorkelling at Mbo Point and No. 4 - take the boat out to the drop off reef and look for turtles, sharks, coral and brightly coloured fish. 10 minute boat ride, \$150 SBD per boat, duration up to 2 hours.

Snorkelling at Vasara Point - similar to snorkelling at No.4, it boasts beautiful marine life on a long stretch of reef. 10 minute boat ride, \$200 SBD per boat, duration 2 hours.

Crocodile Lake Walk- walk to the other side of the island to look for saltwater crocodiles in the freshwater lake near the edge of the sea. The boat will pick you up and you can snorkel on the fringing reefs on the lee side of the island on the way home. \$300 SBD per boat, duration half day.

Vasara Peak Walk-start at the field station and walk through old growth rainforest to the top of Vasara ridge. Free activity, duration half day.

Station to No.3 Forest Walk - start at the field station and walk to Vasara ridge then continue to the Telekom tower which will then take you to your finishing point at No.3. A picnic lunch will be waiting for you at No.3 and then the boat will take you back to the ecolodge. If you wish, you may snorkel the beautiful snorkelling sites on the way back. \$450SBD, walk duration is 3 - 4 hours, ranked as a moderate walk.

Sobu beach walk to Fiha - Boat ride to Sobu then walk along the beach to watch seabirds and lowland rainforest. Your guide will also tell you about the useful plants in the area and show you trees such as Rosewood, Kalifilum, Pometia, Pencil Cedar and more. Ends with a picnic lunch at Fiha and stop for a snorkel at Soe passage on the way back by boat. \$850SBD, duration 5 hours.

Fiha to Tofa beach and bush walk - Boat ride to Fiha then walk to Tofa by beach and bush. See trees and watch birds along the way. Visit a leatherback turtle nesting beach and swim at Tofa river or in the sea. A picnic lunch at Tofa beach. Snorkel on the way back at Soe passage. \$800SBD, duration - Full day.

Singi Bay Snorkelling & Picnic - Snorkel on the vibrantly coloured coral gardens of Singi Bay and end it with a picnic lunch on the beach. \$650 SBD per boat, duration half day.

Fishing- take the boat out in the early morning or late afternoon to trawl line for tuna in the deep sea or reef fish outside the marine protected area. \$200-400 SBD depending on time and petrol use

Barora- take the boat to Barora River where there are a number of beautiful freshwater pools to swim in. Have a picnic lunch by the sea. Bring your snorkelling gear to see freshwater fish and shrimp and snorkel the reefs on your way home. \$950 SBD per boat, full day including lunch

Kaife- take the boat to Kaife at the eastern most tip of the island to see historic custom sites including stone lookouts and forts used during the days of headhunting. Snorkel the clear waters around Kaife Cove and look for turtle nests and hatchlings on the beach. Rinse off in the cool river waters at Kaife. \$1400 SBD per boat, full day including lunch. (can be combined with a visit to Livutana to see the large pods of dolphins).

Livutana- take the boat to Livutana to see the large pod of dolphins that live there. The dolphins love to play alongside the boat and there are good opportunities to photograph them and see them close up. Can be combined with round the island trip or Kaife trip. \$950 SBD per boat, 2 hours. Note, seeing dolphins is not guaranteed but they are seen on more than 95% of trips.

Round the Island- A full day trip around the island including lunch. Choose to stop at Kaife, Barora, Hokata or Raro river and see the dolphins at Livutana on the way around. Depending on time 1 or 2 stops are possible on the way around the island as well as a stop for snorkelling. \$1600 SBD per boat, full day including lunch

Hokata/Sarumana- Hokata is the site of a village in the days before Tetepare was deserted. You can walk into the forest and visit the stone walls of the village and the sacrifice stone and local shell

money. There are snorkelling opportunities on the way home. \$950 SBD per boat, half day on the leeward side of the island

Village Visit- visit Lokuru village on nearby Rendova Island where Solomon Islanders live a traditional lifestyle including tending gardens, fishing, collecting ngali nuts and building leaf houses. Visit local carvers to purchase handmade original carvings and support the local economy. You will be guided around the village and have the option of lunch and/or a cool swim in the river. SBD \$800 per boat (extra charge for lunch), half day.

Overnight stay at Baniata Village to see leatherback turtles- Travel to Baniata village on nearby Rendova Island where leatherback turtles lay their eggs on the black sand beaches. Patrol the beaches at night with turtle rangers and look for nesting leatherbacks. You may have the chance to see hatchlings emerge from the purpose built hatchery that protects the eggs from poachers and monitor lizards. Stay in a traditional leaf house. Note- seeing turtles or hatchlings is not guaranteed, best time to visit is between October and April. Transport \$1200 SBD return per boat (approximately 1 hours from Tetepare), Accommodation \$200 SBD per night per person, food \$90 SBD pp dinner, \$70 SBD pp lunch, \$60 SBD pp breakfast. Trip needs some planning so please book as soon as possible. There is also a custom fee of \$120 SBD per person to visit Baniata.

Washing/Laundry – We can do washing for you, 1 bucket = \$60 SBD

Activity notes:

- Bring your own snorkelling gear
- Bring your own binoculars / birdwatching equipment
- Bring your own power banks for recharging phones and other electronics
- Bring your own torches/flashlights
- 6 pax per boat for all boat activities except for Baniata which is 5 pax per boat
